

What is the SHSP?

- Guides safety activities for all roadway users
- Addresses safety on all public roads
- Strategic, data-driven process
- Federal requirement





How Big Is The Need?

Human costs

- More than 2,500 people die
- Nearly 11,000 are seriously injured

Economic costs

- More than \$22 billion
- \$608 per capita
- Less funding for roads, schools, communities



What is the SHSP Process?

Reduce number and severity of crashes

- Demographic groups
 - Older/younger drivers
- Infrastructure
 - **→** Intersections
 - Roadway departure
- Behaviors
 - → Impaired driving
 - Seat belt use

- Mode types
 - Commercial vehicles
 - → Bicycles
 - Motorcycles
 - Pedestrians
- Foundational systems
 - Crash data
 - Emergency response



What is the SHSP Process?

- Engages partners statewide
- # 4E multidisciplinary process
 - Enforcement
 - Engineering
 - Education
 - Emergency response
- Focus on the greatest problems



A Success Story


- * 177 actions since 2006

Need for the SHSP Update

- * In 2012
 - 2,995 fatalities
 - 10,864 severe injuries
- Unacceptable toll
 - Public health
 - Quality of life
 - Economic impacts


