- <sup>2</sup> Balance of FFY 2013 OA (last FFY's OA balance) -- This is the amount a Region/Program must pay back if it over delivered or the amount a Region/Program will receive to "make whole" if under delivered based on the Division of Local Assistance's (DLA's) OA Management Policy.
