B. Fresno County Rural Transit Agency 2016-17 Annual Budget

<u>Summary:</u> The FCRTA Board of Directors initiated the 45 day review process at the April 28, 2016 Board meeting. The Budget has been prepared to reflect the Fresno Council of Governments (Fresno COG) 2014 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and the Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP) for the Rural Fresno County Area 2016-20120. The budget/document recommends the implementation of programmed service improvements and the continuation of existing services for FY 2016-17. <u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board adoption of the FY 2016-17 FCRTA budget and approval of Resolution No. 2016-06 (attachment).

C. Fresno County Rural Transit Agency Fiscal Year (FY) TDA/LTF Claim

<u>Summary:</u> The FCRTA claim (attachment) is consistent with the proposed FY 2016-17 annual budget. The total claim is for \$4,976,863.00 to support the operations budget of \$8,540,103.00.

Action: Staff recommends approval of the attached TDA/LTF \$4,976,863.00 claim and approval of resolution No. 2016-10 (attachment).

D. Measure C extension Funding for the Fresno County Rural Transit Agency for 2016-17 Fiscal Year

Summary: The FCRTA is processing the annual Measure C funding allocation claim form in the amount of \$2,881,400 which is the estimated revenue setting of 3.99% of \$72,215,532 for 2016-17. This funding allocation is included in the FCRTA annual 2016-17 budget for operations and capital expenditures.

E. Fresno County Rural Transit Agency and the Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission (FEOC) as the Rural Consolidated Transportation Services Agency (CTSA) for FY 2016-17

<u>Summary:</u> The FCRTA and FEOC are co-designated as the Rural CTSA under the Transportation Development Act (TDA) and are claiming \$506,607 for FY 2016-17. This has been reviewed by both agency staff and is consistent with the FCOG Overall Work Program and Budget and in accordance with claiming requirements by State law.

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends approval of the Rural CTSA Funding Claim Resolution No. 2016-11. (Attachment)

F. Grant application to the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District Charge Up Program for \$80,000

Summary: FCRTA was awarded a LCTOP Grant in the amount of \$208,734 for Four (4) Electric vans and are applying for funding available through the charge up program from the Air District in the amount of \$80,000 to offset the overall costs of \$342,212 which leaves a balance of \$53,478 to be paid by the Local Measure program.

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends submission of the Charge Up application to the Air District in the amount of \$80,000 and approval of Resolution No. 2016-08. (attachments).

QUORUM: At the start of the meeting there were 12 members present representing 89.46% of the population and there was a quorum to conduct business. (Coalinga, Firebaugh, Fowler, Huron, Kerman, Kingsburg, Mendota, Orange Cove, Parlier, Reedley, Selma and Fresno County)

ROLL CALL

Mayor Cardenas (Fowler) Vice Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:05pm.

ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of April 28, 2016 Board minutes

Supervisor Perea (Fresno County) made a motion, seconded by Mayor Ramsey (Coalinga) to approve the executive minutes of April 28, 2016. A vote was called for and the motion carried.

B. Change of FCRTA Insurance Broker for 2016-17

Mr. Stites distributed a pamphlet for Dibuduo-DeFendis Insurance Brokers. During the annual insurance renewal process with the current Insurance Broker from Sacramento it was necessary to contact other firms due to issues on processing 2015-2016 vehicle credits and Motor Vehicle Reports (MVR's) for drivers. Staff contacted two (2) local Insurance brokers who handle commercial auto accounts in Fresno and got interest from one and not the other due to the short turnaround of renewal for the commercial auto and excess auto policy which expires on 6/10/16. Fortunately the current insurance carrier (National Interstate) is interested in renewing both policies (commercial and excess auto). The other three (3) policies; Property Insurance, General Liability (Premise Liability), Management Package (EPLI and D&O

Liability) are due to renew on 7/10/16 and 8/01/16. Also with these other policies, the existing carriers (The Hartford, Colony Insurance Co., United States Liability Insurance Co.) are willing to work with the new Broker in Fresno since all FCRTA's loss run history is extremely favorable and makes for favorable rates.

Supervisor Perea (Fresno County) stated appreciation for choosing a local broker; however, although he understood the time constraints, he would prefer staff to go through the public bidding for the next renewal.

Following an expressed opportunity for public comment Supervisor Perea (Fresno County) made a motion, seconded by Mayor Chavez (Huron) to approve Dibuduo-DeFendis Insurance Brokers, LLC to be the Broker of Record representing FCRTA on insurance for 2016-17. A vote was called for and the motion carried.

C. San Joaquin Valley Air pollution Control District (District) and the California Air resources Board (ARB) Board Resolution confirming the match funds and/or in-kind leverage.

Mr. Stites reported that a joint funding application was submitted by a number of Transit Districts in the Valley for a total of \$13.4 million dollars through the ARB's solicitation for Zero Emission Truck & Bus Pilot Commercial Deployment Projects in January of 2016. This project is the first in the Valley and Fresno County to bring advanced zero-emission technology to public transit. The District and ARB have notified FCRTA of a preliminary award for the purchase of four (4) electric buses and four (4) depot chargers in the amount of \$2,514,938 with a required match by FCRTA in the amount of \$335,325.00 and \$502,987 in the form of in-kind (leverage) funds. The 2016-17 FCRTA budget has identified this match of \$335,325.00 in the capital budget for the four (4) electric buses.

Mayor Blayney (Kingsburg) commented on the high cost of the buses. Mr. Stites stated that the cost is higher than other vehicles; however, the upfront cost compared to the useful life of vehicle, minimal maintenance is required, and that the bus is not further contributing to pollution makes it a very cost effective investment.

Mayor Blayney (Kingsburg) asked if there are emission comparisons for electric verses CNG buses. Mr. Stites responded that a very scientific calculation was completed and included in the packet as required by the ARB detailing the emissions, the electric bus is the only one that has zero emissions.

Following an expressed opportunity for public comment Supervisor Perea (Fresno County) made a motion, seconded by Mayor Lopez (Orange Cove) to approve Resolution # 2016-07 as required by the District and ARB.

D. Appoint Temporary Subcommittee to negotiate possible amendment to employment agreement of General Manager.

Mr. Stites stated that similar to years past, the board has appointed Temporary Subcommittee to negotiate possible amendment to employment agreement of General Manager.

Mayor Robertson (Selma) and Councilmember Beck (Reedley) stated they served on the subcommittee in the past and volunteered continued to serve. Mayor Chavez (Huron) also volunteered to serve on the committee as sell.

Mayor Lopez (Orange Cove) made a motion, seconded by Mayor Blayney (Kingsburg) to appoint The city of Selma, Reedley and Huron to the temporary Subcommittee to negotiate possible amendment to employment agreement of General Manager. A vote was called for and the motion carried.
