
  As the Public Works Director for the City of Fresno, I would represent not only our region's largest city but also multi-modal transportation concerns in the urban metropolitan area.

  Some key goals of our General Plan include increased economic development, business and job creation; a successful Downtown; long-term sustainability and improved air quality; supporting agriculture and food production as an integral industry; protecting and preserving natural, historic and cultural resources; a diversity of housing types with complete neighborhoods; improved quality of life in established neighborhoods; increased land use intensity and mixed-use developments to support greater use of transit including BRT; building Complete Streets for all users; expanding the network of well-maintained and connected parks, open space, walking and biking trails; improving public health and
- 5. What do you think are some of the challenges that may be created in addressing these issues?
  Funding will be a significant challenge for the foreseeable future. We need balanced regional policies that support the planned intensification of land uses in the urban core but also respect the General Plans and desired lifestyle of the smaller communities. We also need goods movement corridors that support industrial economic development without seeing those corridors lead to dramatic increases in vehicle miles traveled (VMT) and further impacts to air quality. Emphasizing multi-modal streets and a vibrant, regionally connected trail system will require a shift in focus from previous years.
- 6. Who do you think should be involved in addressing these issues?
  Our regional partners need to work together to have our land uses and transportation policies create the best Fresno County possible. Interested stakeholders and the community need to be engaged, as well as the cities and Fresno County.

Specific to Reedley, we need to become a more well-rounded, sustainable community with services, particularly with more retail and employment opportunities available for our residents, which would enable us to reduce VMT to areas outside the City. However, the current county annexation requirements make that difficult, which we have found to be a hindrance to such potential development. Additionally, for those Reedley residents who are employed in the Fresno area, more convenient public transportation between Reedley (and the other adjacent rural communities) and Fresno is needed (for example, a commuter bus that

5. What do you think are some of the challenges that may be created in addressing these issues?

Regarding the annexation process - revising the MOU between the City and the County is the biggest challenge that needed to be addressed. The challenge is getting the County to accept such revisions. Regarding public transportation - the largest challenge is cost, but ensuring ridership would also be a challenge.

Residents cannot access the needed programs/shopping if traffic is over capacity.

Road maintenance is another issue that is difficult. Many funding sources limit how monies can be spent so there are areas of town that do not get updated infrastructure.

5. What do you think are some of the challenges that may be created in addressing these issues?

Funding, as always, is a big limitation to be able to implement these plans for the community. In addition, the way the transportation funding can be used limits our ability to update infrastructure in portions of town. With a limited pot of money available in the region it is challenging to deal with these issues. Since our communities are not wealthy, it also is a struggle to provide matches for such projects.

Speaking only on behalf of the City of Fresno Department of Transportation, TOD investment along high frequency corridors are the starting point for greater investment in the region. Although this approach may seem unbalanced, to the contrary, this approach offers a solid starting point. Land use improvements will grow after investment in high frequency corridors.

The desire to spread funding to all parties in the region may slow investment in the region. Those investing may see opportunities as being too watered down. Additionally, there is a need for greater coordination in regional goals.

5. What do you think are some of the challenges that may be created in addressing these issues?

Funding and political pressure are the two challenges. Sprawl created absence of a viable core in the city. Transportation has to be a driving force to improve the viability of the core of the city.

Also, there is a need to establish a formula for distributing funds in the region. Scoring for funding digresses to region (rural communities) versus Fresno as a member of the roundtable I will advocate collaboration on behalf of the region. Separate funding could be carved out for smaller cities/rural community roadway maintenance.

The right people, representation throughout the region, seem to be involved. The need is at the policy level, where equitable funding can be established.

Also, a plan for the region should be clearly expressed and be a part of every scoring process.


