### What is Measure C?



Adopted in 1986 and renewed in 2006, Measure C's ½ cent retail sales tax has transformed the transportation landscape in the Fresno-Clovis Metro area as well as Fresno County. Measure C has been widely successful due to its focus on transportation needs in Fresno County.

- ✓ Measure C has improved our freeway system, our local city streets and county roads, and our local and rural transit services.
- ✓ Fresno County was one of the first self-help counties in California.
- ✓ Over the past 37 years, Fresno County has been able to leverage over \$8 billion for transportation because Measure C has been able to provide matching funds.
- ✓ Measure C has continued to provide safe, efficient and affordable transportation for Fresno County's 15-cities/county communities, by connecting us with health care, emergency services, education and jobs opportunities.
- ✓ Under the current measure, annually 35% of Measure C revenues goes directly to local agencies for road maintenance/street repair.





### SOUTH FRESNO SR 99 INTERCHANGE PROJECT

#### MODIFIES NORTH-CEDAR AND AMERICAN AVENUES

- \$37 million Measure C investment to improve safety
- Replaces two aged overcrossings
- Realigns, widens ramps & eliminates isolated ramps
- Installs signalized intersections
- Provides sidewalk & bicycle facilities
- Installs a sound barrier to mitigate traffic noise
- Provides EV charging stations
- Replaces or rehabilitates existing pavement





### **STATE ROUTE 41 EXPRESSWAY**

#### **EXCELSIOR AVENUE TO ELKHORN AVENUE**

- Converts six miles of 2-lane highway to divided 4-lane expressway
- o Improves safety by filling the "GAP" in 44-mile corridor
- \$13 million Measure C investment leveraged
   \$57 million in state & federal funding





### **VETERANS BOULEVARD PROJECT**

- o Construction of a six-lane arterial roadway in northwest Fresno
- Freeway Interchange at SR 99
- o Safety improvements to roads surrounding project
- Grade separations over Union Pacific Railroad, California High-Speed Rail line and Golden State Boulevard
- o Multipurpose trail Hayes to Herndon Avenues

### **FUNDING:**

Measure C invested \$70.4 million that was leveraged with state and federal resources to complete this project



### BLACKSTONE MCKINLEY GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT

- Originally included \$106 Million to Consolidate Burlington Northern Santa Fe and Union Pacific R/R Lines - too costly
- Provisions to Convert to Grade Separation
   Projects if Consolidation Infeasible
- Measure C investing \$75 Million & leveraging the remaining \$87 Million with state & federal funds







- Transit Oriented Development for Infill Development (TOD)
- School Bus Replacement Program – Replaced 147 Fresno County's Oldest School Buses
  - o Improves Air Quality
  - o Enhances School Bus Safety









**Committee Purpose:** To inform the public and to ensure that the Measure C funding program revenues and expenditures are spent as promised.

A handout of Appendix G from the 2006 Measure C Extension Expenditure Plan has been provided to you. Appendix G gives full detail on the Administration Issues and duties of the COC. In summary the committee's responsibilities are:

- The Committee may receive, review and recommend any action or revision to plans, programs, audits or projects that is within the scope of its purpose stated above. Specific responsibilities include:
  - Receive, review, inspect, and recommend action on independent financial and performance audits related to the planning and implementation of the Measure C Extension program.
  - Receive, review, and recommend action on other periodic reports, studies and plans from responsible agencies including the Authority, Fresno COG, the Cities, the County or other agencies. Such reports, studies and plans must be directly related to Measure C Extension programs, revenues, or expenditures.
  - Review and comment upon Measure C Extension expenditures to ensure that they are consistent with the Expenditure Plan.
  - Annually review how sales tax receipts are being spent and publicize the results.
  - Present Committee recommendations, findings, and requests to the public and the Authority in a formal annual report.

### Notifying the Public

This is done with the Measure C Annual Report. Each year a subcommittee of COC members author a letter to the public that includes any presentations, documents, and reports that were provided throughout the year for review, edit or comment. This includes the Annual Expenditure Reporting, the local agency audits, and the budgets for each Measure C fund; 1987 Original Measure, 2007 Extension Measure and the 2010 Regional Transportation Mitigation Fee.

### Review and recommend revisions

The committee can request additional information from the agencies after reviewing budget forms, expenditure reports or audits. You can also request or recommend action from the FCTA Board. An example of actual change due to the action of the COC was the eligibility to use trail funds for maintenance on new or existing trail projects that were funded entirely or partially with non-Measure C funds.
